- 2. What stood out to you in the sermon?
- 3. What was one thing in the sermon that was challenging?

Sermon Specific

- 1. Can you think of a "transactional relationship" in your own experience? What are the ways this kind of relationship can be destructive? What other transactional relationships are there in our culture?
- 2. "Hesed" (The word "kindness" in the passage) not just an act of kindness, but an action of unconditional love. How can we make this kindness a part of our everyday lives? Discuss ways you can bring hesed to your world.
- 3. What are the implications for us in everyday life for being invited to sit at the table of the King? What impact should there be on us and others?
- 4. How does remembering that God is holy and powerful increase our gratitude towards him for what Jesus did on the cross? How is this shown in the story of Mephibosheth?
