We have had an incredible 2018 so far in the Youth Department. It all started with RUSH, and this was a huge highlight for our youth. Many young people gave their lives to Jesus or encountered God for the very first time. The prayer and ministry room was full. There was a felt desperation for God, and many beautiful miracles happened.

During Spring Break we traveled to LA with our older Sr. High students. This year was extra special. We drove four buses with 125 people right into a storm - torrential rain on Skid Row! This turned into the biggest blessing. We set up a coffee shop in a little church right in the middle of Skid Row, and hundreds of desperate homeless people poured into the building to our waiting youth! We greeted them with coffee, and spent three days serving them with prayer, loving the ladies by doing their nails, hair, and make-up, while dozens of people picked up instruments and created a joyful worship team of who sang their hearts out! God created the happiest place on earth right in the middle of one of the darkest places on earth.

This trip was transformative on so many levels. On Easter Sunday we baptized 15 of our youth and celebrated new life with all of their families.

We are so excited about what God is doing and can't wait for the Ark this summer! We're expecting large camps and are hoping to sponsor at least 100 kids to spend a week in our family and experience the love of Christ.

Kids Club & Thrive

Our winter session (January - March) of Kids Club was amazing. We had 35 children attending each week with over half of those children being from outside of our church. Kids were excited to learn and explore about the life of Jesus and the gift of salvation He has offered to everyone. Thrive saw a similar number of grade 4-5 kids who continued to engage in worship and grow in their faith in Christ. These kids have grown to develop a deep relationship with their leaders that we are confident will continue to develop over time.

Kids Church

We have continued to establish a sense of community at each of our services. Saturday night is a quieter time in our classrooms with about 15-20 children from birth to grade 5. They are a committed group though who enjoy hanging out with their leaders as they explore the Bible. Sunday morning has seen many new and returning faces to kids church. It's been exciting to see and hear how God has led these families to join us. Sunday nights Pursuit service continues to grow as families are expanding and others are seeing this as more of a multigenerational service for all ages, not just youth and young adults.

Spring Break Camp

This year's camp was mind blowing with close to 170 kids and 60 volunteers through the week. It officially passed the numbers we would see at our summer camp. Over 50% of the kids were from outside Willow Park Church. Through the week we spoke of having courage and trusting in Jesus to lead the way. Our "kid to kid" project during camp raised over \$800 towards MCC school kits, as kids once again proved generosity comes easily to them when they are given an opportunity to help. **3**

Ministry of Presence

The Ministry of Presence (MOP) has several aspects, each designed to foster connectivity within and health for our church community.

Our "Fellowship for Six" has over 100 people gathering each month in groups of six for food and fellowship.

Our Home Visitation, Care Facility Visitation, and Hospital Visitation teams provide a warm and comforting presence for a large number of shut-ins and elderly as well as those facing medical challenges. We are developing a Parish Nursing program — a health ministry for our faith community which emphasizes the wholeness of body, mind, and spirit — and we are very excited about this. Special thanks to team leaders the Parsons, the Kings, the Blocks, the Goshulaks, and Tracy Foster — and a very, very special thanks to Ken Gerbrandt for conceiving and building this vital ministry from the ground up.

Prime Timers (55+)

Plans are in the works for creating more connecting points and worthy programs for our vibrant and diverse community of older-aged adults. Jim Church holds weekly Bible studies on Wednesday mornings at 10 am (Church@33 Fireside Room). We renewed the "Hymn Sing" which takes place the first Saturday of every month at 10 am (Church@33 Fireside Room). Our recent Hymn Sing saw close to 40 participants including four guitars, a piano, an accordion, a bassist, a saxophone and pedal steel! In lanuary we hosted a 55+ Outreach Lunch at Church@33 that served up soup and sandwiches along with some great musical entertainment and an inspirational speaker to over 120 guests. We enjoyed another 55+ Outreach Lunch on May 25 where Pastor Phil shared an inspiring story about the last preacher on the Titanic. Many people responded to the Gospel!

Christmas & New Years

Christmas was such a busy time. So many new people attended from the community & we have seen the ongoing fruit of this beautiful start to 2018. The New Years celebration service was well attended and the spiritual devotion was so inspiring.

A Church of Prayer

We began the year with 21 Days of Prayer, and it was terrific to see a growing number of our congregation engaging with the Lord in a more profound way.

WillowOne Prayer nights continue to be a highlight of the month as these very special gatherings certainly build community and spiritual momentum, which is reflected in the amount of people that come to Christ through our weekend gatherings.

Groups

Two new community groups started this spring. Grief Share, Divorce Care and Alpha have all been well attended. We ran our first ever Men's Set Free with 36 attending and it was a powerful time. Men Unite gathered every month and went through the Andy Stanley series called "Follow".

The Work as Worship Retreat had 35 people attend, it has been inspiring to see people catch a vision for mission in the workplace.

The Vancouver Marathon running group raised over \$25,000 for Child of Mine in May. Amazing!

Hope Centre

The Hope Centre is now working in partnership with the Kelowna Gospel Mission, and we see between 20 and 50 people visiting this weekly outreach. Many receive help with our "Baby Basket" program and counselling.

Easter

12 responded on Easter morning and 20 baptisms have taken place through this period. A blessing!

South

I want to give you all a little update on what has been going on at the Glenmore campus since the New Year:

Christmas

We had such a special time over Christmas with many people coming out to join us at our Christmas Eve service. It was so encouraging to see the church alive over Christmas. Since then we have been building off that momentum and working to build a solid foundation for a great future in the Glenmore area.

A Growing Church Community

When I reflect on all the exciting things that have been happening in our church over the past number of months three key areas are brought to mind.

First, I see how we as a church are maturing into a community that genuinely cares for one another other and is committed to each other and to those in our lives that don't yet know the love of Jesus.

Second, I am encouraged by the excitement that has been growing with us meeting together and praying in Glenmore on a monthly basis. There will be no real growth in our community if it is not rooted in prayer.

Third, it has been so encouraging to see new faces regularly attending on Sunday mornings and choosing to call Willow Park Glenmore their home. Over the past month or so we have been averaging nearly 70 people per week. There has been a really positive feeling in the church. It has also been encouraging to see our young adults group grow to 25. Such a great group.

Creekside

Creekside continues to experience the faithfulness of God and the faithfulness of His people. After a challenging summer and early fall which found us moving from venue to venue, it has been good to resettle into our regular home. The challenges we faced could have set us back as a church, but instead, the church family has rallied and we are as strong numerically as we have ever been, with over 100 adults and likely 50 or more children and youth most Sunday mornings. We are truly a multi-generational church and it is our goal that our services would be inclusive of all ages as much as possible.

Children & Youth

Our children's department has continued to be a thriving part of our church community, as Jeanette and Sean Lipinski have given us such consistency and strength as leaders.

Other volunteers run separate grades 4-6 and 7-12 youth classes every Sunday morning and this willing heart is so key to the spiritual health of Creekside. A young couple, Steven and Kelsey Warkentin continue to serve as midweek youth leaders, opening their home to our young people every other Tuesday evening. They have done this now for several years and they have been such good models for our youth in terms of a healthy marriage, family and what it means to live as a follower of lesus Christ.

Seniors 55+

We have a strong seniors group that meets regularly each month for fellowship, prayer and mutual support. This group has been an integral point of connection for many people. There are 20-30 who show up regularly each month and this group has gone from being purely a social gathering to becoming more of a spiritual support group - prayer has become a significant part of each meeting.
